

## Additional Information 9F: Report on Compliance and Mapping

### **THE REPORT OF MAPPING EXERCISE OF THE WMO LEARNING OUTCOMES AGAINST THE RTC CURRICULUM**

A committee comprising the instructors at the Regional Training Center, Oshodi, met on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of December, 2017, to deliberate and have an assessment on the course and topics covered in the Training School curriculum in compliance with the required Quality Management Systems (QMS) for the Regional Training Center

A mapping exercise of the WMO learning outcomes against the course curricula of the Training School was done in accordance with the WMO 1083 guidelines. The outcomes of the deliberations which include the courses that address these outcomes, the related learning outcomes and objectives for the course, the level of compliance and how these outcomes were assessed were noted. Which are:

- i. There is a need to restructure the course curricula
- ii. Tools for adequate facilitation and assessment especially in the areas of practicals and field work are required
- iii. There is a need to collaborate with other organisations for enhancement of studies and knowledge among the students
- iv. Subsequent meetings would be held for further deliberations on the course contents and materials for study


A mapping of the course curricula of the Training School was done in accordance with the template received from the Education and Training Department of WMO. The outcomes of the deliberations which include the courses that address these outcomes, the related learning outcomes and objectives for the course, the level of compliance and how these outcomes were assessed, which are as follows:


- a) Courses were attached to the learning outcomes at their various levels
- b) The various outcomes which were not covered by the existing curriculum were identified at the mapping meeting
- c) There was a cognate assessment of the outcomes which were the continuous assessment and examinations.
- d) The levels of compliance of the taught and practical courses were highlighted, which were satisfactory.
- e) It was discovered that some of the expected outcomes of the objectives of some courses were for higher levels (for specialized courses for meteorologists)

At this juncture, courses which were not covered by the mapping were directed to the Curriculum Review Committee for necessary action.
