


GBON Gap, January 2022

Surface reporting density



Gap in SIDS and LDCs (standard density): **596 surface stations**; existing network (actively reporting) delivers roughly **9% of required number of observations**;

Upper air reporting density



Gap in SIDS and LDCs (standard density): 139 upper air stations; existing existing network delivers roughly 8% of required number of observations;

SOFF direct support: First Implementation Period

- Focus on SIDS and LDCs
- Other developing countries Readiness technical advisory

How to access SOFF resources

- 1. Expression of interest to the SOFF Secretariat from the WMO PR
- 2. SOFF assesses the list of interested countries and proposes the sequencing of support based on the SOFF programming criteria
- 3. Countries are informed
- 4. IE and peers are informed about the prioritized countries and requested to express their interest in supporting the country
- 5. The country decides with what IE and peer advisor to work

 - First round of funding request to be approved by the steering committee
 - Proposal for second batch of countries approved
