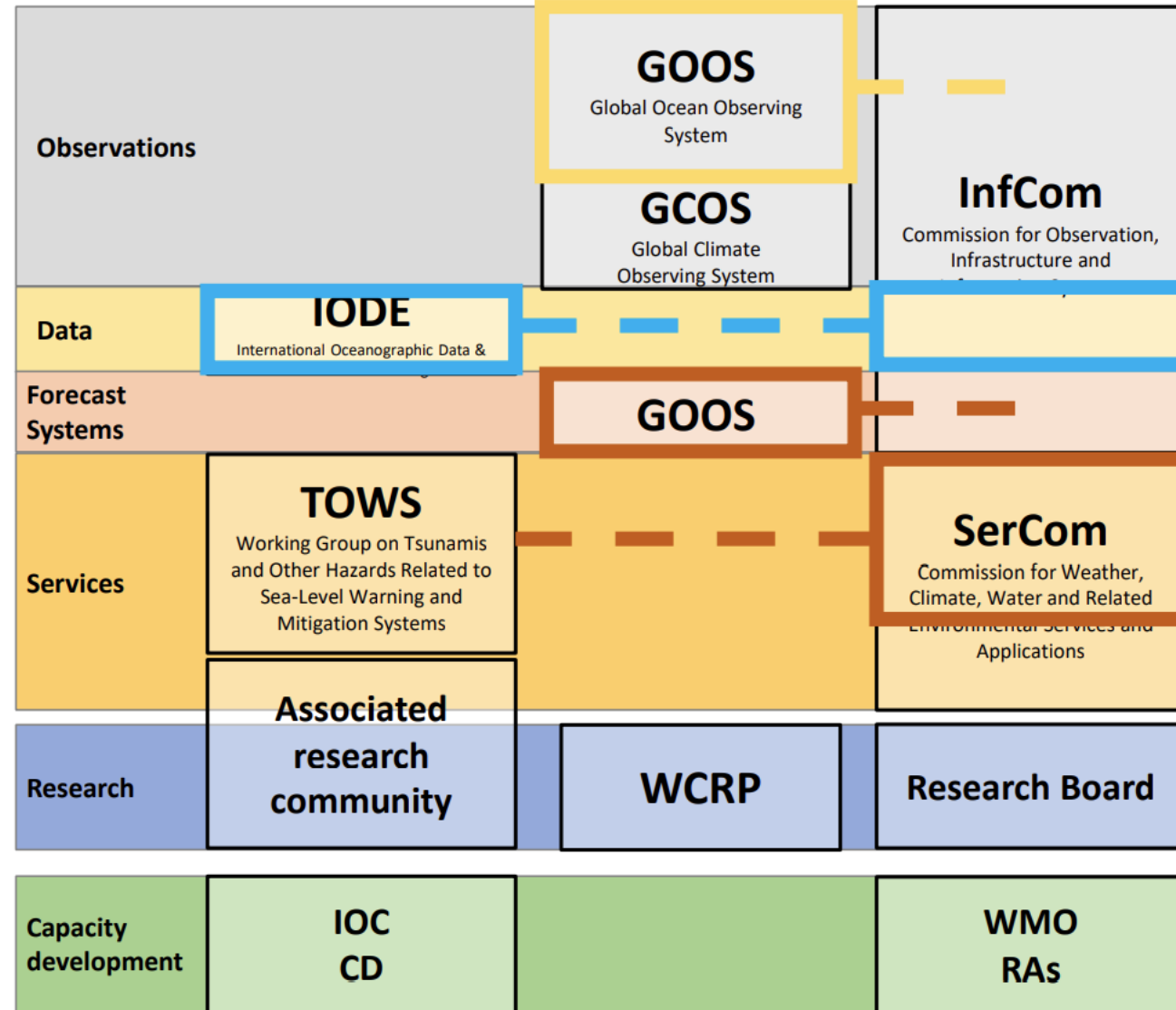

JCB Strategic Developments

- New *IOC Capacity Development Strategy 2023-2030*, for adoption by IOC Assembly in June 2023

Vision

Through international cooperation, IOC will assist its Member States to collectively achieve the IOC's high-level objectives, and in doing so support the delivery of the societal outcomes of the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030), with particular attention to ensuring that all Member States have the capacity to meet them.

IOC CD Strategy 6 outputs

1. Human resources developed at individual and institutional levels
2. Access to technology, physical infrastructure, data and information established or improved
3. Global, regional and sub-regional mechanisms strengthened
4. Development of ocean research policies in support of sustainable development objectives promoted
5. Visibility, awareness and understanding on the roles and values of the ocean and ocean research in relation to human wellbeing and sustainable development increased
6. Sustained (long-term) resource mobilization reinforced
