

JCB Strategic Developments

 New IOC Capacity Development Strategy 2023-2030, for adoption by IOC Assembly in June 2023

Vision

Through international cooperation, IOC will assist its Member States to collectively achieve the IOC's high-level objectives, and in doing so support the delivery of the societal outcomes of the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030), with particular attention to ensuring that all Member States have the capacity to meet them.

IOC CD Strategy 6 outputs

- 1. Human resources developed at individual and institutional levels
- 2. Access to technology, physical infrastructure, data and information established or improved
- 3. Global, regional and sub-regional mechanisms strengthened
- 4. Development of ocean research policies in support of sustainable development objectives promoted
- 5. Visibility, awareness and understanding on the roles and values of the ocean and ocean research in relation to human wellbeing and sustainable development increased
- 6. Sustained (long-term) resource mobilization reinforced
