SOFF - A new vertical UN climate fund

- Established in November 2021 by WMO, UNDP, UNEP as a UN Multi-Partner Trust Fund (UNMPTF), launched 1 July 2022
- Provides long-term technical and grant-based financial assistance to enable countries to acquire and internationally exchange GBON data
- Focused on supporting Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs)
- A delivery vehicle for the UN Early Warnings for All initiative

SOFF basic features and value proposition

Innovative finance	 Results-based, long-term finance, incl. operations and maintenance Grants-only, recognizing a global public good
Technical competency	 Peer-to-peer technical assistance by advanced met offices

Readiness

- GBON gap analysed and reviewed
- GBON national contribution developed and verified
- Country Hydromet Diagnostics undertaken


Investment

- GBON infrastructure in place
- GBON human and institutional capacity developed

Compliance

- GBON data internationally shared and results-based finance provided
- Annual GBON compliance report published

Which countries can access SOFF support?



SOFF Operations: Ambitious delivery in 2023

Targets

- 55 first implementation period countries programmed by June
- **30 countries completed Readiness phase by COP28**, i.e., have in place a national assessment and developed a plan how to close the Global Basic Observing Network (GBON) data gap
- 10 countries moved to Investment phase by COP28

Ease of access

- SOFF to provide results-based support for investment and long-term open-ended compliance
- SOFF resources to be blended with resources from Implementing Entities that will invest in the latter part of the value chain

How to access SOFF resources?

- 1. Expression of interest to the SOFF Secretariat from the WMO PR
- 2. SOFF assesses the list of interested countries and proposes the sequencing of support based on the SOFF programming criteria
- 3. Countries are informed
- 4. Implementing Entities and peers are informed about the prioritized countries and requested to express their interest in supporting the country
- 5. The country decides with what Implementing Entity and peer advisor to work
